REQUEST: Staff recently completed a cost-of-service study for EMS that indicated that our EMS fee schedule does not cover the full cost of service. Please confirm whether and how the proposed EMS fee schedule reflects the increases allowed per the cost-of-service study and whether and how those increased fees are being reinvested back into EMS.

RESPONSE:

EMS rates are set at full cost of service in the FY 2023-24 budget, according to the latest cost of service study. EMS budget in FY 2023-24 includes a total increase of \$3.9 million in anticipated revenue and a total increase of \$12.2 million in proposed expenditure funding over prior year amounts. Of the \$12.2 million increase in expenditures, \$5 million reflects new or continued investments in EMS, further described in the table below.
