Austin Public Health has several youth-oriented and youth-focused programs that include the following:

- Austin Healthy Adolescent an adolescent health-oriented program.
- Austin Youth Development educational and skills development program for youth who have had limited opportunities and/or have not completed high school.
- Youth & Family Services designed to provide Austin youth with career development opportunities, inclusive with all 7 independent school districts, charter, private, parochial schools and Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, and those who are homeschooled.

### Austin Public Library:

The proposed FY24 budget for Austin Public Library (APL) includes allocation for youth services, including after-school programs and recreational activities in the Youth Services unit at Central Library of \$1,119,000. APL also funds these activities throughout the system at branches from the budgeted funds in Programs and Partnerships, as well as Branch Services Divisions, however the appropriations are not specified by type of program at that level for flexibility. Also, funding is provided by the Austin Public Library Foundation to facilitate program activities Library-wide.

#### Parks and Recreation:

For Fiscal Year 2023, the Parks and Recreation Department allocated approximately \$9.9 million for youth services, including after-school programs, summer camp and youth focused recreational activities.
