fine Jas C. Blower The mayor also reported to the Council that he had remitted a fine assessed against James C. Blower for Vagrancy, subject to the approval of the Council. This remission is made on the condition that said Blower leaves the city at once.

relieved. J. M. Odell A communication from city attorney recommending that Mr. J. M. Odell, who became responsible of to the city for the payment of fine and costs assessed against A. C. Munson, in the event fine. that Munson did not pay it, be not required to liquidate the same, inasmuch as Munson has left the city, and will doubtless remain away; that the marshal hold the commitment so that Munson may be arrested should he return to this city.

The mayor also advised that Mr. Odell be relieved of liability, and on motion the recommendations were Concurred in.
