1. CITIZEN COMMUNICATION

- a. Stuart Hersh signed up, but did not speak.
- b. Frank Harren requested that the task force take care in how we define sustainability. There is a faction promoting managed growth, and we need to be careful not to repeat the mistakes of 30 years ago with the Austin Tomorrow plan. Policies have caused Austin to sprawl, and we are less dense than Houston; we have traffic congestion and clean air problems. He recommends promoting a compact city.

Judge Cooper called a vote and the motion passed by majority vote.
