Current Discussion Draft

- Cleans up preamble
 - More up-to-date language
 - Changes two-week Council reporting requirement to quarterly
 - Retains mandatory disclosure language
- Will contain three exhibits
 - Competitive matters list (currently in draft)
 - Annual reporting requirements
 - Long-term power purchase and resource acquisition disclosure requirements



Competitive Matters (Exhibit A)

- Reduced 50 categories to 27
 - Some consolidations
 - Eliminates many categories examples:
 - Most capital costs
 - Fuel budgets
 - Vendor identities
 - Much financial information
 - Streamlines remaining categories
- Intent was to get down to unit specific levels
- Better clarifies that information that is publicly reported to regulatory agencies is NOT competitive



Competitive Matters

- Four main categories
 - Fuel, wholesale power, and generation
 - Customer information
 - Language regarding statutory privacy rights added
 - Non-electric retail goods and services
 - Includes new category for employee workforce development information
 - District cooling



Time Limits

- Other than customer information, there is generally a two-year maximum withholding period
 - Period starts after end date for contracts
- For long-term contracts, release will occur five years after *execution*, if this occurs before expiration
 - City Manager may override five-year provision by certification to City Council



Work Remaining

- Continue stakeholder dialogue to refine draft resolution and improved reporting requirements for Exhibits B and C
- Return to EUC in July for further public input and Commission discussion
- Return in August with final staff recommendation
