Ranking Priorities Ground Rules

- 1. As required by the legislative mandate of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act, all meetings of the Needs Assessment Committee are open to the public. During meetings, only voting members and staff (Planning Council Support, Planning, and Grantee/Administrative Agent) may participate in discussions and deliberations. Meeting guests may provide comment to the committee during "Public Comment Periods" as listed on the meeting agenda.
- 2. Utilize the best available, accurate, and detailed information to identify service gaps/emerging needs. The responsibility of the Needs Assessment Committee is to make recommendations as how limited Part A resources can be used, and incompleteness of data should not be used as a justification for not making a decision.
- 3. Respect the group decision-making process. If your personal opinion differs from the final decision reached by the group, do not criticize or dismiss the group's final decision as incorrect or misinformed.
- 4. Members are expected to follow the Planning Council's conflict of interest guidelines as defined by the Planning Council's By-Laws (Article IX-Conflicts of Interest).
