Director's Report

Dare to Go Zero

Dare to Go Zero is a new reality-show style competition hosted by the City of Austin Solid Waste Services Department. Tasked with going Zero Waste, four Austin families will learn how to reduce the amount of waste they generate while being filmed and participating in challenges throughout a five-week period. Department Re-Branding

The Director submitted a memo to the City Manager with a summary of the renaming process to date, including a recommendation for a new name and options for a new logo. The decision on the new name is under consideration and will be announced in conjunction with the Master Plan in the summer of 2011. Renaming the Department will result in some immediate expenditures; however a slow change-over will reduce the fiscal impact. Staff has estimated the cost of the name change-over to be approximately \$75,000 in the first year, with no major fiscal impacts on future years.

Universal Recycling Ordinance

<u>Phase 1</u> - The 6th Stakeholder Meeting for the URO Phase 1 Rules was on Tuesday, May 24th. Meetings occur every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month. The following meeting, scheduled on June 14th, will cover: 1) service provider registration process and 2) data reporting, forms, and protection of competitive or private information. All meetings are held from 9am to 11am at the SWS Administrative Offices, 1520 Rutherford Lane.

<u>Phase 2</u> - The meeting on May 17th was cancelled due to lack of quorum. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 21st at 2:30pm in City Hall. Aiden Cohen will provide a presentation on other City's commercial recycling programs. The committee has committed to a meeting schedule and topics, discuss waste characterization data, and identified target materials for restaurants.

Juneteenth

Solid Waste Services will be providing trash, recycling, street sweeping, and litter control services for the Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 18th. Staff will provide recycling containers and volunteers to monitor trash and recycling receptacles. Solid Waste Services will have an outreach booth with an incentive program to reward participants for picking up trash and recycling. In addition, event vendors will receive training on event recycling and waste reduction as well as a list of green guidelines in their event info packets. The guidelines emphasize the importance of City's ban on Styrofoam and glass at events held at Parks facilities.

Blues on the Green

Solid Waste Services will be providing trash and recycling roll-offs for the Blues on the Green summer series. The event will use approximately 50 recycling containers for the three month series. Staff will also host an outreach booth for two concerts – July 20th and August 3rd.

Event Recycling

The Event Recycling Rebate Program details are in their final stages and awaiting legal review. In the interim, staff has been working with service providers to ensure that the event recycling rebate provides enough incentive to encourage recycling and other waste diversion activities at events. Data gathered from the rebate program will help develop an event recycling ordinance in the future. Additionally, staff recently met with Right of Way Management other departmental stakeholders to discuss establishing minimum standards for waste management at events. Discussions are on-going.

Employee Recognition and Awards

<u>Road-e-o Award Winners</u> - We are proud to announce that two SWS employees were awarded 3rd place in their categories at the TXSWANA Road-e-o in Dallas; Chris Guerrero (Automated Side Loader) and Bobby Brown (Tractor Trailer).

<u>2011 Environmental Awareness Awards</u> - The goal of the City of Austin Environmental Awareness Awards is to recognize the efforts of individuals and groups that are making significant contributions to the protection and enhancement of our environment. One of this year's winners: Solid Waste Services - Recycling Program for City Sponsored Events. Special recognition should be given to Jessica King, Gena McKinley, Claude Moore, Dennis Roberts, Ray Armstrong, Kelly Joyner, Lionel Benford, all members of the Litter Abatement Team, as well as previous employees Rebecca Hays, Liane Miller, and Mindy Noel.

<u>One Green Step</u> - The Austin chapter of the International Association of Business Communicators recognized the 2010 One Green Step event featuring Richard Garriott in the Communication Management/Marketing Communication category at its annual Bronze Quill Gala on June 2.
