Community Services Block Grant Programmatic/Financial Report

The Community Services Block Grant funds the delivery of services to very low income Texas residents in all 254 counties. These funds support a variety of direct services in addition to helping maintain the core administrative elements of community action agencies.

Grantees are to provide a broad range of services designed to eliminate poverty and foster selfsufficiency. Services and activities are to address one or more of the following:

- Employment
- Education
- Better Use of Available Income
- Housing
- Nutrition
- Emergency services
- Health

For the City of Austin, the grant provides funding for the delivery of basic needs, case management, preventive health and employment support services through the City's six (6) Neighborhood Centers and the Community Health Initiative Outreach Team.

Financial/Programmatic Updates for CSBG ARRA Grant (as of 12/31/09)

- December financial report to TDCHA shows YTD expenditures of \$39,090.15. The first quarter of the grant focused on planning and implementation and executing contracts for childcare, workforce development and direct financial assistance. Services have been implemented, staff trained and contracts executed therefore we anticipate an increase in expenditures during the remaining quarters.
- Social workers are currently working with 64 households of which 76 individuals have been referred to Workforce Solutions for enrollment in the occupational skills training program or the electrician's pre-apprenticeship training program.
