




- To develop off leash areas that are evenly distributed throughout the city;

Meeting Guidelines and Goals

The purpose of this public meeting is to gather feedback from the community through an open forum of discussion on two proposed sites for an off leash area.





Criteria for future site selection of Off Leash Areas

- Sufficient distance from residential properties;
- 50 to 300 feet from springs, or other critical environmental features;
- Sufficient acreage for support facilities: parking, maintenance area; etc..
- Design should:
 - Be clearly marked and well signed;
 - Be equipped with mutt mitts, trash receptacles;
 - Have available parking;
 - Avoid accelerated erosion;
 - Encourage movement of people and dogs;
 - Comply with all City of Austin Codes;

Yett Creek Park



- PARD purchased the 40 acres park in 1989;
- Yett Creek Park is located in NW Austin, just west of MoPac south of Parmer Lane;
- Park has a 1 mile nature trail;



Why Yett Creek Park for an Off Leash Area

- No Off Leash Areas exist within the NW sector of the city;
- Compatibility with adjacent land uses;
- No significant environmental sensitive features;
- Parkland that has low usage;
- Parkland meets the criteria for sustainable off leash parks
- Nearest Off Leash Area is more than 5 miles away;
- Park has limited future recreational uses due to its function as a regional detention




Guidelines for a Sustainable Off-Leask Area

- Sufficient distance from residential properties;
- 50 to 300 feet from springs, or other critical environmental features;
- Design should:
 - Be clearly marked and well signed;
 - Be equipped with mutt mitts, trash receptacles;
 - Have available parking;
 - Avoid accelerated erosion;
 - Encourage movement of people and dogs;
 - Comply with all City of Austin Codes;

- How far will the off leash trail be from people's backyards? Will there be fencing?
- What impacts will the use have on the existing wildlife?
- Will people be parking on the residential streets in the neighborhood?
- Where would be the entrances to the park be?
- Wanting the park to stay as is.

- Results of the exercise are in your back-up




Mabel Davis District Park



- 50.03 acres purchased in 1974
- Developed and opened in 1979
- Named after Mrs. Alden (Mabel) Davis
 - Helped organize the Austin Area Garden Center
 - Served as the Center's first President
- A section of the park is located over an old landfill that operated from 1944-1955
- Park was closed in May 2000 (except for the pool) for remediation of contaminants found in soils of undeveloped area of the park
- Landfill cap was added in response to remediation in 2005

PARD Long Range Plan (LRP) and East Riverside Oltorf Combined Neighborhood Plan


Recommendations

Why Mabel Davis District Park




- Compatibility with adjacent land uses
- Nearest OLAs:
 - Onion Creek Greenbelt the only OLA in the SE region of the city
 - Norwood Tract at Lady Bird Lake
- Park has limited recreational uses due to capped former landfill

Concerns expressed at the community meeting

- Concerns that there are too many uses at Mabel Davis already (ie...pool, skatepark, playscape).
- Concerns about the capped pesticide and public health?
- Concerns about the aggressive dogs in the neigh. that will use the park.
- Concerns about the water quality of County Club Creek.
- Would like to see other uses like ballfields instead.
- Concerns about increase crime and safety in the park.
