#### Single-Use Bag Ordinance – Update

Numerous stakeholder meetings in September, October and November to research opinions and issues involved. Public meeting was held Oct 24<sup>th</sup>. Director met with various bag manufacturer representatives. Law Office is assisting in the writing of the ordinance. SWAC discussion of draft ordinance is scheduled for December 14<sup>th</sup>. We anticipate Council posting of the proposed ordinance by the end of December. Council discussion (and possible action) is scheduled for January 26<sup>th</sup>.


FY 10-11 (Oct 2010 – Sept 2011) Net Recycling Revenue: \$998,389


