This contract is for the supply of automotive batteries and repair parts necessary to maintain the City's fleet of light and medium duty vehicles. The parts to be provided under the contract are after-market automotive parts that will be used to repair and maintain all models of vehicles that are supplied from different automobile manufacturers. The parts will be ordered on an as needed basis.

This contract is the result of a competitive bid awarded by The Cooperative Purchasing Network (TCPN). The Cooperative Purchasing Program was established as a national structure for government agencies to make use of their collective purchasing power, and is authorized under the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.

The Purchasing Office conducted an analysis to determine that the TCPN contract with O'Reilly Automotive, Inc (dba O'Reilly Auto Parts) was the best value to the City. This contract offered the lowest price and includes products that fully meet the needs of the City. Utilizing TCPN contracts provides for volume discount pricing as well as the earliest delivery of ordered items.
