Additional Backup Information					

During the 82nd Texas Legislative Regular Session in 2011, Senate Bill 18 ("SB 18") was passed into law and became effective September 1, 2011. SB 18 significantly changed Texas condemnation law. One such change was to Section 22206.101 of the Texas Government Code. The new provision requires an entity with eminent domain authority to submit a letter (via Certified Mail Return Receipt Requested *OR* "CMRRR") to the Texas Comptroller stating two things. First, the entity must assert that it is authorized by the State of Texas to exercise the power of eminent domain. Second, the entity must identify its legal authority to do so. All such entities must submit this letter by December 31, 2012 or its power of eminent domain will automatically expire. Since the City of Austin is an entity with the power of eminent domain authority, it must submit this letter as required. The purpose of this RCA is to initiate the process of complying with the above-mentioned provision of SB 18.
