White Cane Day Oct 20, 2011 Republic Square Park; Over 454 attendees Mayor Lee Leffingwell presented proclamation. This event highlights the independence of persons who are blind or visually impaired.

Disability Mentoring Day Oct 19, 2011at Goodwill Community Center Council Member Kathy Tovo presented proclamation. Committee presented five scholarships to DMD participants. This event offers career exploration and job shadowing opportunities to youth with disabilities in high school and college.

Barton Springs Pool ADA Improvements

Committee members provided testimony and education to the Parks Board, Friends of Barton Springs and city staff on accessibility improvements leading to pool area. In addition, members' recommendations impacted design of ramps; suggestions made it to current plan completion at 60%.

Imagine Austin

Committee members attended meetings and represented interests of disability community concentrating in the areas of transportation and housing.

ADA Roundtables

In 2011, Committee members participated in coordinating ADA Roundtables with the Texas Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities. The ADA Roundtables are an effort to deliver free training programs about the Americans with Disabilities Act to state and local ADA Coordinators, HR personnel and to the public.

ADA Access and Sidewalk Task Force

Committee members participated in these community meetings to discuss the built environment and projects targeting accessibility improvements.

Parking Mobility

The Committee submitted a recommendation to City Council for the support of this initiative identifying violators of accessible parking with new mobile app.

Emergency Preparedness

In June 2011, the Committee co-hosted a listening session on the issues of importance for persons with disabilities during emergency situations, with Marcie Roth, Director, Office of Disability Integration and Coordination - Department of Homeland Security/ FEMA. Committee member, Ron Lucey was appointed to the State Task Force on Emergency Management.

Transportation

During several presentations by Capital Metro, the Committee provided feedback on their paratransit services resulting in changes to policy including one relating to services to Austin area public schools. Following several requests by the Committee, the 2002 policy handbook was finally updated.

Election Study Group

Committee member participated in reviewing plans for new voting centers voicing concerns for disability community. Additionally, the group reviewed proposal for a new accessible voting system.

UT Student Open House/Orientation

The purpose of this event was to provide students with disabilities the opportunity to see the campus, sit in on mock classes and generally immerse in college setting. The summer of 2011 Open house was a great success with 60 students participating. Committee member helped organize and publicize event.
