On November 10, 2011, Council passed a resolution directing the City Manager to prepare recommendations and provide funding strategies for an interlocal agreement with Austin Travis County Integral Care (ATCIC) in order to support additional mental health services from ATCIC. Austin Travis County Mental Health Mental Retardation Center d.b.a. "Austin Travis County Integral Care" (ATCIC), the state-designated mental health and mental retardation authority for Travis County, provides a wide range of out development, educational and behavioral health services to the community.

The City's funding primarily serves as a grant match so that ATCIC can leverage state, federal, and other sources of funds for the provision of early childhood intervention services, homeless services, behavioral health services, and intellectual/developmental disability services to indigent residents of the Austin/Travis County.

The Interlocal Agreement also supports "Authority Services" at ATCIC, including but not limited to mental health disaster preparedness; prevention, education & awareness; community planning; and maintenance of infrastructure.
