## Additional Backup Information

This contract is for Workers' Compensation Third Party Administrator Claims Management Audit services which will provide for on-site audits of the Third Party Administrator who is under contract to provide statutorily required Workers' Compensation benefits to City employees.

The purpose of the audit is to ensure compliance with all Texas laws and administrative rules associated with the management of the City's Workers' Compensation claims, as well as compliance with contractually established standards for claims handling practices and the utilization of nationally recognized medical treatment guidelines. Additionally, the audit will verify customer service performance, the proper medical management of claims, and the prompt review and payment of medical bills to providers and indemnity payments to injured employees.

In order to maintain the integrity of the Workers' Compensation program, an audit is anticipated to be conducted on an annual basis.

The evaluation panel consisted of professional and managerial staff from the Human Resources Department, Risk Management Division, Austin Police Department's Risk Management Division, Austin Fire Department, Human Resource Department, and Emergency Medical Service, Safety Department. Staff recommends this vendor as submitting the best proposal, based on evaluation criteria including reasonable rates, experience, and knowledge.

These services were originally solicited in an RFP issued during the summer of 2011, with an RCA on the October 20, 2011 Council Agenda. After Council approval and award of a contract to Partners Assurance, the firm later informed the City that they could not complete the services due to a key employee's departure from the firm. The RFP was then re-issued.

This request allows for the development of an agreement with a qualified offeror that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the selected offeror, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified offeror and authorize contract negotiations with this provider.
