ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING A PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT TO THE VOTERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. A charter amendment election shall be held in the City on November 6, 2012 at which the ballot shall be prepared to permit voting "yes" or "no" on the following proposition:

Proposition ---

Shall the City Charter be amended to provide that the City Council appoint the City Attorney?

PART 2. If Proposition --- is approved by the majority of voters voting at the election, Article V, § 6 of the Charter is amended to read as follows:

§ 6 CITY ATTORNEY.

The council shall appoint a city attorney who shall be the head of the [There shall be a] department of law [, the head of which shall be the city attorney, who shall be appointed by the city manager]. The city attorney shall be a competent attorney who shall have practiced law in the State of Texas for at least five (5) years immediately preceding the city attorney's [his or her] appointment. The city attorney shall be the legal advisor of, and attorney for, all of the officers and departments of the city, and the city attorney [he or she] shall represent the city in all litigation and legal proceedings. The city attorney [He or she] shall draft, approve, or file [his or her] written legal objections to, every ordinance before it is acted upon by the council, and the city attorney [he or she] shall pass upon all documents, contracts and legal instruments in which the city may have an interest.

The city attorney may appoint [There shall be such] assistant city attorneys as may be authorized by the council [and appointed by the city manager,] who shall be authorized to act for and on behalf of the city attorney.

PART 3. This ordinance takes effect on ----, 2012.
