## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Austin City Council Resolution

August 4, 2011
Directs staff to develop a city ordinance providing a "comprehensive phase-out of single-use plastic bags offered at retail checkouts"

## March 2, 2012

Council Adopts regulations of carryout bags within the City limits, offering three bag options.

## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Timeline

> 3/2/12 - Council Public Hearing \& Adoption
> March, April, May - Research \&
Development of Implementation Strategies, discussions with bag manufacturers, other cities, and local retailers.
> June - Development of Director Rules
> June - Began Outreach and Education

## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Timeline

> July - RFP Release for Media Campaign
> July - Post Director Rules for public comment
> August - Director Rules adopted
> August - Council considers media campaign RFP
> December - Public Media Campaign rolls out
> March 1, 2013 - Full implementation of Ordinance

## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Ordinance Purpose

Replaces Single-Use Carryout Bags
with defined Reusable/Recyclable Bags

## Permitted Reusable Bags

Reusable Carry-out Bags - 3 choices

- Cloth, washable fabric, or other durable materials
- Recyclable paper (with director standards)
- Recyclable plastic, 4 mil thickness \& handle


## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Director Rules

> Paper Bag Definition - Recycled Content \& FSC
> Plastic Bag Definition - 4 mil \& handle
> Alternative Compliance - "Walk Test"
> Retailer Parking Lot Signage Requirements
> Customer Education at Point of Purchase
> Prohibits carryout bags at all City facilities
> Cease distribution of Single-Use Carryout Bags by March 1, 2013

## Single-Use Carryout Bags

## Hardship Variance

> Retailers may petition for Hardship Variance
> Hardship Emergency Bag Option

- "Disposable Bag Fee" per transaction
- \$1.00 per transaction through Dec 31, 2013
- \$1.50 per transaction through Dec 31, 2014
- Fee revenue utilized for reusable bag promotions
- Reports to City
- Re-evaluate Emergency Bag Option late 2014
