PROPOSAL

Relocate a ca. 1932 house to outside the city limits.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story rectangular-plan side-gabled frame cottage with a full-width inset porch on plain square wood posts and non-historic square wood rails; single and paired 1:1 fenestration; synthetic siding; Craftsman-style wood door with triple glazing in the upper half of the door. The house has a ca. 1940 addition to the left side of the main house; it is one-story, rectangular-plan, side gabled, and covered with synthetic siding to match that on the original part of the house.

RESEARCH


The house appears to have been built in 1932. The first owners and occupants were Marion E. ("Red") Eggeling and his wife, Billie (or Willie, as she appears in the 1935 city directory). Red Eggeling was an electrician who later worked for Jennings Electric in Austin. He died in a car wreck in 1970. The Eggelings lived here only until around 1936; the next owners and occupants were Roy and Floy Duncan, who lived here from 1936 to 1948. Roy Duncan was a native of Llano, Texas, and was a salesman for the Kuntz-Sternenberg Lumber Company while he and Floy lived here. The next owners and occupants of the house were Weldon and Lorene Hutcheson. Weldon Hutcheson also was a salesman at Kuntz-Sternenberg Lumber Company; they lived here until around 1953. The house had a high turnover of residents after the Hutchesons; it has been a rental unit since the early 1960s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the relocation permit. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

Duncan died October 1, 1995 in Llano County.
