# Who are we and what do we do?

- PCC was founded over 40 years ago by members of the Austin community and has strong long-standing community support.
- Today we are the healthcare home for 10,000 low-income and uninsured patients providing more than 32,000 medical visits annually plus a broad array of supportive services.



## What makes PCC special?

PCC has developed *unique* programs (Integrated Behavioral Health, Center for Adolescent Health, Rx for Fruits and Vegetables) innovatively addressing community needs.

PCC has forged *strong partnerships* in the community (Lifeworks, Austin Children's Shelter, SafePlace) bringing healthcare to vulnerable populations with satellite clinics.



## What are the challenges?

PCC's current facility is landlocked and operating at capacity.

The community has unmet healthcare needs.

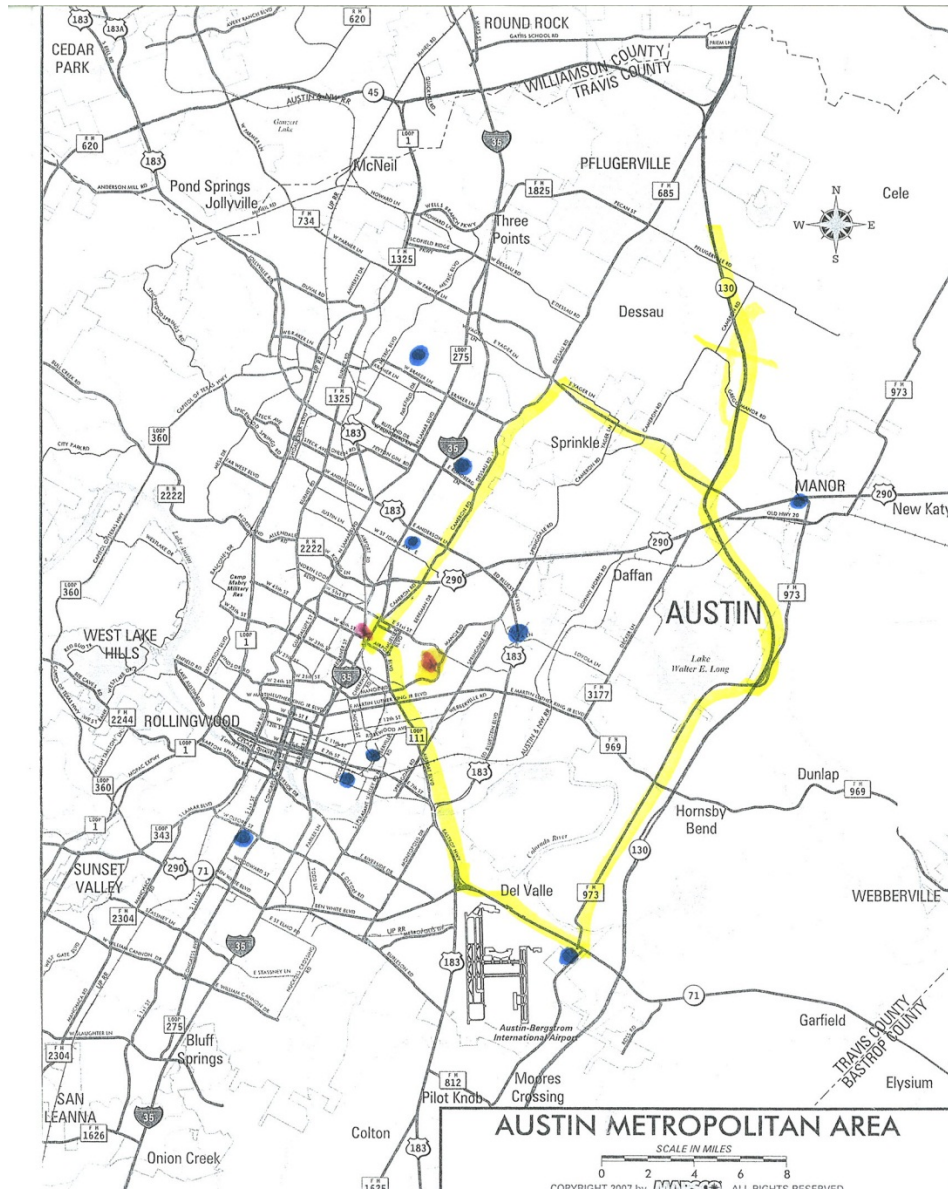




# We are ready to meet the challenges

- On June 20, 2012 PCC received notification that it had been granted Federally Qualified Health Center status.
- The FQHC program supports primary care providers serving large numbers of uninsured patients in medically underserved communities.
- FQHCs must meet strict requirements that include having consumer boards that represent the community and providing accessible care.
- FQHC status allows PCC the means to increase capacity, expand access and deliver additional services.





There is *significant unmet need* in these areas

#### 78721

- 7,211 low income population
- 11,425 total population
- 77% not served by a public health clinic

#### 78723

- 14,048 low income population
- 28,330 total population
- Over 75% not served by a public health clinic

#### 78724

- 10,587 low income population
- 21,696 total population
- 70% not served by a public health clinic

#### 78725

- 2,901 low income population
- 6,083 total population
- 79% not served by a public health clinic





PCC has the opportunity to build a modern, uniquely Austin primary care clinic on donated land at **Rathgeber Village**.

This site is located on a bus line in central East Austin and in close proximity to the Dell Children's Hospital.





## What is the funding plan?

Lead anonymous donor:	\$1 m
New Market Tax Credits:	\$2 m
Foundation support :	\$6 m
Individual donors:	\$1 m
City bonds:	<u>\$2 m</u>

**Project Total:** **\$12 m**
