3213 BONNIE ROAD

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1942 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story rectangular-plan side-gabled stone-veneered frame house with a central entry, 1:1 fenestration, a front-gabled over-door hood on triangular knee braces; standing seam metal roof; rear addition with a partial-width shed-roofed independent porch; exterior stone chimney. The stone veneer has been painted.

RESEARCH

There is no building permit for the construction of this house, but city records do reveal a water service permit that may be for this address in 1937 and a building permit for an addition in 1942. City records also indicate a sewer service permit from 1943, but the actual permit is no longer extant. The address first appears in the 1944-45 city directory as a rental property; the first known occupant was Cecil D. Eskew, who was in the U.S. Army at the time he rented this house. The house has been primarily a rental unit for most of its existence – in the late 1940s, it was rented by Bryce and Patricia Cecil; he was a trainer at the State Board of Vocational Education and later at the State Department of Education. Students rented the house in the late 1950s and early 1960s; an inspector for the State Health Department rented it in the late 1960s. The first owner-occupant of the house was Richard D. Horn, who is listed in the 1973 city directory. He worked for a consulting engineering firm. Elizabeth Stull, who did not list an occupation in the city directory, was the owner and occupant of the house in the late 1970s. The house then became a rental unit through the 1980s.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permit. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.
