









Intakes by age group compared to last year















June was a tremendous month for adoptions. With 721 animals finding new homes, the Center easily set an all-time adoption record for the month of June (June 2010 and 2011 held 2nd and 3rd place, with 676 and 659 adoptions, respectively).

Our partners also came to the rescue this month by helping us find placement for 800 animals, with most of them very young (neonatal) kittens.

This month saw a sustained volume of adult dog intakes, climbing up above 700, which was considerably higher than June of last year (653). Many of these dogs came in with serious illnesses or injuries (at least 10 brought in suffered immediate, traumatic injuries and were humanely euthanized, at least 20 more were severely ill and unable to survive).

Kitten Season means overall an influx of cute and adoptable kittens, but it can also mean an influx of ill, injured, and abandoned kittens, all of whom struggle to survive. Of the 900 cats we took in, 68 were humanely euthanized, and 16 passed away in our care. The majority of the cats euthanized (35) had severe illnesses, including panleukopenia and renal failure. Others had suffered traumatic injuries, and several more were severely aggressive feral cats who were too unwell for placement options.






