Public Health Interlocal

- Originally approved for FY2008 for one year with four one-year renewals; FY2012 was final year of contract.
- FY2013 is a one year contract with no renewals
 - HHSD and ASO will have two separate contracts with the County beginning FY2013
- Cost model components
 - Population
 - Units of service
 - Targeted funding

Proposed FY13

- Cost Drivers
 - Population increase
 - Increased employee benefits
- ASO Proposed Changes
 - Net increase \$325K
 - Decreased 5-year avg. calculation to 3-year avg.
 - Calculation correction for Shelter Services
- HHSD Proposed Changes
 - Net increase \$397K
 - Changed revenue calculation
