BRIEF EXPLANATION OF PROPOSED RULE

Austin City Code Chapter 6-4-10(A) (Facilities Regulated) requires a commercial facility, multifamily residential or City municipal facility situated on property equal to or greater than 1.0 acre in size to obtain an evaluation of any permanently installed irrigation system in accordance with a schedule determined by rule. This rule provides a schedule for irrigation inspections of commercial properties to be performed every other year based on the address of the property to be inspected and establishes the use of a compliance plan and the application of fines.

TEXT OF PROPOSED RULE

Facility Assessments, as required by Chapter 6-4-10(A), shall be conducted in accordance with the following:

- A. Evaluations of automatic irrigation systems situated on an affected property must be completed every 2 years.
- B. Evaluations of permanently installed automatic irrigation systems on properties with odd number addresses shall be due on odd number calendar years. Evaluations of automatic irrigation systems on properties with even number addresses shall be due on even number calendar years.
- C. Evaluations of permanently installed automatic irrigation systems shall be due on a schedule determined by the zip code of the affected property where the zip code schedule is kept on file with Austin Water Utility and posted on the Austin Water website.
- D. Modifications to the zip code schedule made by Austin Water Utility shall be communicated to the service account holder of the affected property a minimum of 6 months prior to the submittal due date as described in Paragraph C.
- E. Irrigation evaluations shall be considered valid for a period not to exceed 90 days from the final inspection date by an AWU Authorized Irrigation Inspector. Documentation of the evaluation must be submitted not later than the last day of the month during which the inspection is due.
- F. An irrigation inspection necessary for the issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy from the applicable land development jurisdiction shall satisfy the requirements of Chapter 6-4-10(A) for a period of two years from the date of issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy.
- G. Failure to provide the required documentation to Austin Water Utility in accordance with the required schedule shall result in enforcement action taken by Austin Water and will include, but is not limited to, the assessment of fines in accordance with Chapter 6-4-5(B), *Fees and Charges*.
- H. Properties unable to pass the required irrigation evaluation by the required due date because of system noncompliance with Austin City Code, Chapter 6-4-12, *Water Waste Prohibited*, are required to notify Austin Water Utility in writing in accordance with the required zip code schedule. This notice at a minimum shall include a Compliance Plan. Failure to provide the Compliance Plan by the specified time will result in a daily accrual of fines.
- I. At a minimum the Compliance Plan shall include the property owner's name and address and a plan to immediately eliminate water waste on the affected property. Reinstatement of an irrigation zone rendered inoperable by the Compliance Plan will require documentation from an AWU Authorized Irrigation Inspector to be submitted to Austin Water Utility for approval prior to the zone being reinstated.

AUTHORITY FOR ADOPTION OF PROPOSED RULE

The authority and procedure for adoption of a rule to assist in the implementation, administration, or enforcement of a provision of the City Code is provided in Chapter 1-2 of the City Code. The authority to regulate the water use is established in Texas Local Government Code Section 552.001 and Title 6 of Austin City Code.
