




### CO2 Emissions per Employee





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# 2007 Climate Protection Resolution



- 5c. develop a menu of greenhouse gas reduction strategies for local implementation that citizens and organizations can fund through the purchase of "carbon offset" credits, thereby reducing their own carbon footprint;
- 5e. promote carbon neutrality among visitors by providing mechanisms and incentives for the purchase of offset credits by travelers, conventions, tradeshows and festivals.






## What are carbon offsets?



A carbon offset is the third party verified legal claim to a **reduction in emissions** of greenhouse gases (CO<sub>2</sub>) made in one place, **to offset an emission** made elsewhere.

# 2010 Local Carbon Offset Pilot





#### **TreeFolks**

- Soil / Biomass sequestration
- Offsets: 1 mt CO<sub>2</sub> per year
- Timeline: 2013



#### **Foundation Communities**

- 5kW Solar PV at M-Station
- Offsets: 4 mt CO<sub>2</sub> per year
- Timeline: Spring 2012



## **Yellow Bike Project**

- 11.4 kW Solar PV array
- Offsets: 8 mt CO<sub>2</sub> per year
- Timeline: Spring 2012





# **Proposed Model**





## Potential Impact of 1 million PICCs sold at \$1 each

\$500k - Verified Emission Reductions @ \$10 / ton

= 50,000 mt CO<sub>2</sub> offset

\$500k - Sustainability Projects in Austin

@ \$200 / ton

=  $2,500 \text{ mt CO}_2 \text{ offset}$ 

+ Water, food, air benefits


