Additional Backup Information			

This is a contractual agreement between the City and Bank of America for provisional banking services necessary for the City's Utility Billing System, known as the Customer Care & Billing (CC&B) System. The CC&B system provides the City with utility billing service for customers of the City's utilities. The provisional agreement will be for a term of up to 10 months.

The City entered into a five-year depository contract with Bank of America in 2008 as a result of a Request for Application (RFA), in accordance with Texas Local Government Code 105. In 2012, a new RFA was issued and a subsequent contract award was made to JP Morgan Chase. This provisional agreement is necessary in order to make the required Information Technology modifications to align the CC&B system with the City's new Depository, JP Morgan Chase.

The competitive bidding process in Local Government Code Chapter 252 does not apply to this procurement. Local Government Code Chapter 105 applies, and Section 105.018 authorizes the award of this contract.
