FY 2013-14 CIP Plan Process Overview

- Purpose of the CIP Plan
 - Identifies City's projected major capital improvements over the next five+ years
 - General government and Enterprise departments
 - Funded and unfunded requests
 - Planning and budgeting tool
 - Identifies how we are planning on appropriating and spending capital funds
 - Identifies and prioritizes expected capital needs
 - Based on reasonably anticipated revenues
 - Communication tool for public transparency

PC & CIP Committee Roles

Planning Commission Role:

 Make an annual recommendation to City Council on the City Manager's proposed CIP Plan

CIP Committee Role:

- Make a recommendation to Planning Commission
- Draft PC letter for inclusion in CIP Plan
- Provide oversight/review of draft CIP Plan
- Provide strategic feedback/guidance to staff for incorporation into this year's CIP plan and/or future CIP plans

CPO/Budget Office Responsibilities

- Strong communication/coordination between Capital Planning and Budget offices
- Capital Planning Office CIP strategic planning
 - Analyze CIP planning information from citywide perspective balancing priorities
 - Review department CIP narratives
 - Work with depts. to identify how they are meeting citywide and department priorities through the CIP
 - Facilitate coordination between departments
 - Liaison to the Planning Commission CIP Committee

CPO/Budget Office Responsibilities

- Budget Office Financial resources
 - Analyze financial information from citywide perspective
 - Review department spending, appropriation, and funding plans
 - Develop bond appropriation/sale schedule
 - Utilize CIP Plan information to develop O&M projections for Financial Forecast
 - Prepare Capital Budget and present to Council

What are we doing now?



 Departments are prioritizing capital needs, based on:

- Technical assessments of infrastructure
- Public input from planning efforts
- Requests from City Boards and Commissions
- Fulfilling voter-approved G.O. bond programs
- Addressing citywide and department priorities
- Developing proposed spending and appropriation plans for funded and unfunded projects
 - Updating spending plans for completing existing capital projects
 - Plans for allocating GO bond funding to specific projects
 - Developing cost estimates for unfunded requests
 - Reviewing within context of reasonably anticipated sources of funding and ability to deliver projects within timeframe proposed

Next Steps for Staff



- Capital Planning Office and Budget Office review department submittals (February March)
 - Review from a citywide strategic and financial planning perspective
 - Ensure spending, appropriations, funding plans balance and reflect CIP planning as described in Dept. narratives
 - Work with departments to adjust as needed
- CPO/Budget Staff compile Draft CIP Plan
 - Budget Office also prepares Draft Bond Sale Schedule, and
 - Provides draft operating costs from CIP projects for Budget Office's annual Financial Forecast of operating expenditures and revenue in April.
- Review with Dept. directors and City Manager
- Provide Draft Plan to CIP committee in April/May
