HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION MARCH 25, 2013 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS 1218 E. 51ST STREET HDP-2013-0059

PROPOSAL

Demolish two houses, both of which were moved onto the site in 1948-1949.

ARCHITECTURE

Although both houses now have the same address of 1218 E. 51st Street, historically, the yellow house facing Lancaster Court has borne the address of 5104 Lancaster Court.

1218 E. 51st Street

One-story, rectangular-plan front-gabled frame house with two front doors, 1:1 fenestration, and a central, partial-width front-gabled porch on turned wood posts.

5104 Lancaster Court

One-story wing-and-gable plan vernacular late Victorian frame house with a partial-width independent porch on plain square wood posts. The house has a projecting bay on the left side, containing a 6:6 window and a rectangular-plan one-story shed-roofed addition on the rear containing a bank of four 6:6 windows. There is a larger, single picture window in the projecting front gable; it has a rectangular transomed configuration. The front doors are at 90-degree angles to each other, both opening onto the front porch. Both doors are modern replacement doors.

RESEARCH

City permits and city directories reveal that both houses were moved onto the site in 1948-1949, although there is confusion about which building was actually moved to the site from 303 W. 18th Street. The house moving permit from 1948 shows that the house at 303 W. 18th Street was moved to 1218 E. 51st Street, and it may be that the house shown on the 1935 Sanborn map as 1714½ Lavaca Street was the structure actually moved to E. 51st Street with a front porch then added. The house at 303 W 18th Street does not match the configuration of either house, but is more closely aligned with the house currently at 5104 Lancaster Court, which may have had additions (such as the projecting bay on the south (left) side of the house and enclosing the rear porch) when it was moved to its current site.

Both houses have always been used as duplexes on this site, with a high turnover of tenants. The tenant lists include a railroad clerk, a car mechanic, an attendant at the State School, a cab driver, an iron worker, a garbage truck driver, and the proprietor of a laundromat.


STAFF COMMENTS

The houses are beyond the bounds of any city survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permits. Neither house has the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual landmark designation.





BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Merlin C. and Elizabeth (Betty) Adams (ca. 1930 – ca. 1932)

Merlin C. and Elizabeth Adams appear in the 1930 U.S. Census in a rented house at 2914 San Gabriel Street in Austin. Merlin Adams was then 54, had been born in Texas, and was a salesman for an oil company. Elizabeth Adams was then 52, and had been born in Texas. They had four children: Gladys, 24, Joy, 21, Mark, 18, and Mary, 16. None of the children had an occupation listed in the census report.

Merlin Adams died in Travis County on March 27, 1942.



Merlin Adams' World War I draft registration card (1918) shows that he and Bettie were living in El Paso, and that he was a self-employed auto livery man.

James D. and Katie Easton (ca. 1932 – ca. 1934)

James D. and Katie Easton appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as renting a house at 403 W. 15th Street in Austin. James D. Easton was then 64, had been born in Texas, and was a grocery salesman. Katie Easton was then 42, and had been born in Texas to German-born parents. She had no occupation listed. The couple had five children: James D. Jr., 26, a clothes presser; Chris, 25, a mill-man in a lumber mill; Lucy, 21, a telephone operator; Thomas, 18, a driver for a florist; and Varner Bell, 13, all of whom had been born in Texas. The family also had a lodger, 20-year old Leola Schroeder, a telephone operator.

Bertha Epperson (ca. 1936 – ca. 1943)

Bertha Epperson appears as the renter of this house in the 1940 U.S. Census, when it was still located at 303 W. 18th Street. She was a 46-year old Texas-born divorcee who was a house mother in a boys' dormitory. With her lived her 23-year old daughter, Erlene Bingham, a book-

keeper for the LCRA, and her son, Jay Bingham, 25, a construction carpenter, Jay's wife, Florence, 28, and their son, Kenneth, 4.


Bertha Epperson died in Travis County, Texas, December 12, 1994.

Warren and Inez Clift (ca. 1943 – ca. 1948) – the last occupants of the house before it was moved to its current site.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Warren and Inez Clift owning their house in Vernon, Texas. Warren Clift was then 35, had been born in Texas, and was a trucking contractor in the oil field. Inez Clift was then 32, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. The couple had two sons, Robert, 6, and William, 4.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Warren and Inez Clift living in Crosby County, Texas, on a farm they owned. In addition to sons Robert and William, the Clifts had two daughters, Mary L, 11, and Ruth, 3.


Warren Clift died in Stephenville, Texas on October 3, 1967.



Warren Clift's World War I draft registration card shows that he was living at Lingleville, Texas, and worked as a mechanic for an electrical company in Abilene. He was single.



The 1935 Sanborn map shows a house with a partial-width front porch and a partial-width back porch at 303 W. 18th Street (RED circle) – this configuration does not match up exactly with either of the two houses on the site but is closer to the house that is currently at 5104 Lancaster Court than the house that is currently at 1218 E. 51st Street. The house outlined with a GREEN

circle may be the house that was moved to 1218 E. 51^{st} Street, but the scale appears to be smaller than that of the current house. There are no city directory listings for $1714\frac{1}{2}$ Lavaca Street.

The 51st Street and Lancaster Court area of the city does not appear on the 1935 nor the 1962 Sanborn map.
