Authorize negotiation and execution of a 5-month Contract for early childhood services with CHILD, INC. in an amount not to exceed \$557,280.

Additional Backup Information

Council approval of this recommendation will prevent the loss of the 2013 Head Start summer program for at least 500 children ages 3 – 5 years. The full-day Program will last at least 8 weeks primarily in the months of June, July and August 2013. Additional benefits are the prevention of summer learning loss and preventing working parents from having to find alternate summer care.

Child, Inc. is the only Head Start grantee for Austin. Head Start is a federal program that promotes the school readiness of children ages birth to 5 from very low-income (under federal poverty level) families by enhancing their cognitive, social and emotional development. Head Start programs provide a learning environment that supports children's growth in: language and literacy, cognition and general knowledge, physical development and health, social and emotional development, and approaches to learning. Head Start programs provide comprehensive services to enrolled children and their families, which include health, nutrition, social services and other services determined to be

necessary by family needs assessments, in addition to education and cognitive development services. Head Start services are designed to be responsive to each child and family's ethnic, cultural and linguistic heritage. Head Start emphasizes the role of parents as their child's first and most important teacher, and builds supportive relationships with families.
