## Additional Backup Information

On February 25, 2013, the Health and Human Services Department (HHSD) received a revised Notice of Grant Award from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act 2010, Public Prevention Health Fund: Community Transformation Grant approving a carryover request from Year 1 of a five-year grant period that began September 30, 2011 through September 29, 2016 in the amount of \$32,201 for a grant total award of \$1,058,359.

The Community Transformation Grant plan to utilize the carryover grant funds to continue the implementation of grantor-required strategies to create healthier communities by supporting implementation of interventions in five strategic areas:

- Tobacco-free living

- Active living and healthy eating
- High impact evidence-based clinical and other preventive services
- Social and emotional wellness
- Healthy and safe physical environments

The approved Community Transformation Implementation Plan (CTIP) addresses the needs of Austin/Travis County with special focus on the populations that experience health disparities. The plan is categorized across multiple sectors addressing where people work, play, learn, live and access social services. These categories are community, school, worksite, healthcare, media and disparities.

There are no anticipated changes in performance measures. This amendment affects year two of a five year project period. The remaining three years of the grant period are dependent of the federal budget continuing the prevention-finding program of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
