	PROPOSED CHANGES IMPACTING HOUSING AFFORDABILITY: THE MAJORITY OF CHANGES ARE CLARIFICATIONS OR ACTUAL INCENTIVES TO THE EXISTING ORDINANCE AND SHOULD NOT IMPACT HOUSING AFFORDABILITY OR PRODUCTION. 25-1-21: CLARIFY DEFINITION OF PRINCIPAL BUILDING ENTRANCE. 25-6-477: ADD BIKE PARKING IF LAND USE CHANGE REQUIRES MORE BIKE PARKING, LOCATION OF BIKE PARKING WITHIN 50 FEET OF ENTRANCE, PARKING TO BE LOCATED IN BUILDING OR GARAGE. 25-6-472: SHOWERS DO NOT COUNT TOWARD FAR 25-2-474: VARIANCE TO ADJUST PARKING DOES NOT INCLUDE BIKE PARKING. HAS SEPARATE WAIVER PROCESS; BIKE PARKING CONSIDERATION/OPTION WHEN MODIFYING PARKING TO CONFORM WITH ADA OR UBC 25-6-478: PARKING REDUCTIONS DO NOT REDUCE BIKE PARKING REQUIREMENT. 25-6-476 (MIXED USE) BIKE PARKING CONSIDERATION/OPTION WHEN MODIFYING PARKING TO CONFORM WITH THIS SECTION. 25-6-591; ESTABLISH BIKE PARKING CALCS IF DOWNTOWN PARKING IS ELIMINATED.
