LATM – Program Review

- Presented Guidelines and Procedures to UTC -November & December 2011; August 2012.
- Request-based program initiated in January 2012
- Currently only addressing speeding mitigation
- 2 funding rounds/year
- Eligible requests ranked for funding

LATM IDIQ Construction Contract

- Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ)
 Construction Contract
- Bids opened in July; low bid \$1.68 million
- Council approval September 2012
- Entire contract authorization utilized for 12A and legacy traffic calming projects
- Estimated \$1.3 million for construction of 12A projects, leaving \$1.4 million in unfunded projects

LATM & Neighborhood Traffic Calming

- Funding for LATM:
 - \$2.9 million current program budget
 - Up to \$3 million for construction of next 3 funding cycles
 - New IDIQ construction contract for future cycles
- Legacy Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program
 - 2 neighborhoods substantially complete- Crestivew & Park at Quail Creek
 - 3 neighborhoods in design phase –Perry Lane, Rosedale, Galindo
 - 1 neighborhood in pre-design process Old Enfield
- 1 Self Funding Neighborhood SSRC/Willow Springs

LATM Criteria Review

- Reviewed & implemented changes to eligibility & ranking for funding criteria:
 - Eligibility Criteria changes: 5 speed-related crashes within a consecutive 12 month period in the last 3 years
 - Ranking for Funding Criteria changes:
 Streetlighting 10 points toward funding if no or substandard streetlighting on street segment
 - Crash History total number of speed-related crashes in last 3 years
