Notice of Appeal from Granting of OMV Permit to Lucy's Retired Surfer Bar and Grill 506 West Ave Austin, TX 78703

Austin City Lofts Neighborhood Association, as an interested party under Austin City Code §9-2-55, hereby appeals the decision of the City of Austin's accountable official in granting an outdoor music venue permit to Lucy's Retired Surfer Bar and Grill (Lucy's). Austin City Code §9-2-56(F) specifies boundaries within which neighborhood associations may not appeal a permit-approval decision. Lucy's is located **outside** the western boundary; thus, *this appeal is authorized*.

The grounds for this appeal are as follows:

Lucy's building and patio directly abuts our 12-story residential building that has 84 residential units

Lucy's continuously has operated an outdoor sound system with pre-recorded music without an OMV permit since they opened.

Prior to Lucy's opening, its ownership was informed about the Austin Noise Ordinance, with its requirement for an OMV permit in order to produce amplified outdoor sound. It was pointed out that even after obtaining the permit, Lucy's would have to abide by cut-off times and decibel limits. Nonetheless, without obtaining a permit, Lucy's placed outdoor speakers on the front and back patio areas and continuously has played loud music through the speakers since opening the bar. The bar plays outdoor sound beyond the cut-off times specified by the ordinance and often has exceeded the 85-decibel limit specified by the ordinance.

Individual residents of Austin City Lofts have met with Lucy's owners and management in an effort to get Lucy's to quiet down and be a better neighbor. That has not worked.

Lucy's often hosts live music on a soundstage in the bar with the speakers pointed toward our building. Bass and drum noise easily penetrates the thin metal walls and large glass roll-up windows of Lucy's into our building and can be heard clearly by residents on almost all floors during performances. Lucy's typically rolls up the large windows during these performances, increasing the noise and functionally turning Lucy's into an outdoor music venue.

For the above reasons, the Austin City Lofts Neighborhood Association urges the City Council to take the following actions:

- 1. Deny Lucy's an OMV permit.
- 2. Restrict Lucy's from opening its "garage doors" during any live music performance inside the bar.
- 3. Make clear to Lucy's that amplified sound broadcast from within the building through open doors or windows is considered outdoor amplified sound and is subject to OMV permits as well as cut-off times and decibel limits provided by the Austin Noise Ordinance.
