Additional Backup Information

The EMS Department has been providing emergency medical services to Travis County for over thirty years. The most recent Interlocal Agreement, Amendment Four, with Travis County for EMS services was signed by the Deputy City Manager on January 17, 2013, for FY 2012-2013. This Amendment to the Agreement enhances the City's provision of EMS services to those areas of Travis County that are located outside the City of Austin's corporate limits by increasing Travis County's ambulance count by one 12/7 Unit, and the increase of six Medic I Field Personnel to staff this ambulance. The monthly EMS fee to be paid to the City will be increased by \$47,209.50 for FY 2012-2013. There will be a companion Budget Amendment to increase the EMS Budget to reflect this increase.
