PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1951 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, irregular-plan, flat- to hipped-roof, stone-veneered Mid-century Modern house with metal-frame casement and multi-light picture windows, an exterior chimney clad in stone, and a partial-width independent porch.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1951 by the Brentwood Corporation, a local developer. The first owners and occupants were Gilbert and Maudine Schmitt for the rest of their lives. Gilbert Schmitt was an engineering graduate from the University of Texas, who worked in utilities for his entire career, starting at Central Power and Light, and coming to the Lower Colorado River Authority in 1938. He became the assistant general manager of the LCRA. After Gilbert's death in 1981, the house was sold to Richard and Ernestine Rainey.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and re-use of this house, which is a very good example of Mid-century Modern design, exemplified by the stone veneered walls, exterior chimney, and large banks of metal-framed casement and picture windows. If the demolition permit is released, staff recommends release only upon the completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Gilbert and Maudine Schmitt (ca. 1951 – ca. 1984)

Gilbert and Maudine Schmitt appear in the 1940 U.S. Census; they lived in a rented house at 605 E. 38th Street in Austin. Gilbert Schmitt was then 33, had been born in Texas, and was an electrical engineer for the Lower Colorado River Authority. Maudine Schmitt was also then 33 and had been born in Texas. She had no occupation listed in the census report. They had lived in San Antonio in 1935. With them lived Maudine's niece, Jo Belle Humphreys, 15. Jo Belle had been born in Texas, had lived in Kingsville in 1935, and had no occupation listed. Gilbert Schmitt appears as the 23-year old son of Lorenz and Mathilde Schmitt in the 1930 U.S. Census. The family lived in Seguin, Texas, where Gilbert was an electrical engineer for a power company. His father, who had been born in Texas, was a carpenter. The 1920 U.S. Census shows Gilbert living on the family's farm in Guadalupe County, Texas. Both Gilbert and his older brother, Monroe, were listed as farm laborers on the home farm.

Maudine Schmitt died March 5, 1976 in Travis County.

Ex - LCRA executive Schmitt dies Monday

Gilbert Eugene Schmitt, 2805 Greenlee, a former Assistant General Manager of the Lower Colorado River Authority, died Monday in Houston at age 75.

Funeral services will be at 10:30 a.m. today in the Weed-Corley Funeral Home. Burial will be in Austin Memorial Park.

A 1928 Engineering graduate of the University of Texas, Schmitt worked for Central Power and Light Co. before starting his career with LCRA in 1938. A member of several civic organizations, Schmitt also served as Vice-President of the Austin Chamber of Commerce.

Schmitt is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Henry A. (Pat) Bunting of Rockwall, four brothers, Walter, Hugo and Monroe of Seguin, and Ben Schmitt of Fort Worth; and two grandchildren.
