



Water flowing into the Highland Lakes






Lake forecast







Projections take into account emergency drought relief measures affirmed by TCEQ on February 13, 2013.

Weather outlook



- Little chance for any drought-busting storms
- Rainfall expected to be normal or slightly below normal this summer (i.e., hot and dry)
- Temperatures expected to be slightly hotter than normal, similar to last summer but not as bad as the scorching heat of 2011

Stage 2 remains in place





- Combined storage at 713,000 AF (35%)
- Stage 2 (1 X week watering) in effect since September 4, 2012
- Expected to remain in place for next several months
- Stage 3 trigger possible later this year if conditions worsen

Stage 3 possible this year





- Combined storage at 600,000 AF (28%)
- 1 X week watering with reduced hours
- Reduced hours for patio misters, splash pads
- Filling of spas prohibited
- Other measures as necessary

- Expansion of aerator/showerhead program
- City facility efficiency audits
- Consultant draft report on city codes and auxiliary water issues expected September 2013

Citation issued if no notice of correction returned or noncompliance withnessed again by COA staff


FY 13 Enforcement Activity

 - 53 MF







Annual Reclaimed Water Use





- FY13: 1.01 BG To-Date (4.04% of total wastewater treated; 55 customers)
- FY12: 1.52 BG (4.34% of total wastewater treated; 43 customers)
- FY11: 1.45 BG (4.65% of total wastewater treated; 40 customers)
- FY10: 1.09 BG (3.01% of total wastewater treated during wet year with very low demand; 36 customers)
