



## Community Connection Program

Eligibility-

facilities whose primary purpose results in public participation in the Community Connections are intended for public or non-profit services provided at the facility

Schools
Libraries
Community Centers
Municipal Building
Public Facilities

All sites must be within Austin City limits, and within qualifying fiberhoods


