

Key Issues

- Population Growth with 5 major proposed housing developments
- Budget constraints
 - Del Valle ISD Tax Rate \$1.53
 - Maintenance and Operation Tax Rate \$1.04
 - Debt Service (I&S) \$.49
 - *School Districts cannot issue new bonds for building construction unless they can guarantee that the debt service tax rate will never rise above 50 cents through the life of the 25-30 year bond.

Challenges

- Need for outside services brought to schools and community
- Public transportation
- No big box grocery store or doctors offices in district
- Need additional schools to address growth
- Parental involvement
