4. ACTION ITEMS

Authorize negotiation and execution of a professional services agreement with **AECOM TECHNICAL SERVICES, INC.**, (staff recommendation) or one of the other qualified responders to RFQ Solicitation CLMP129, to provide engineering services for the ABIA eALP and Utility Mapping project in an amount not to exceed \$450,000.

These funds will be used to refund previously issued Airport System Prior Lien Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2003. Refunding these obligations is intended to result in present value savings exceeding the City's target guideline of 4.25%.

We anticipate purchasing the three (3) mobile homes currently under contract in September and October, 2013, as we are assisting

the occupants to find replacement housing.

Of the thirty-two (32) acquired homes, two (2) are occupied and thirty (30) have been vacated. Asbestos abatement and demolition have been completed on twenty-seven (27) of the vacated mobile homes. The next round of abatement and demolition is scheduled in September, 2013. We continue to assist homeowners who are not lawfully present in the U.S. but who have children who are U.S. citizens. We are also working with owners of mobile homes trying to purchase conventional homes or trying to put homes on raw land.

In summary, of the thirty-eight (38) mobile homes in the park, thirty-two (32) have been purchased. Six

(6) mobile homes remain to be purchased.

LÁWSUIT-SH71 Partners filed a reply to the City's response, and the judge issued a final dismissal. SH71 Partners may appeal by September 6, 2013. To-date, we have utilized the escrow account to help relocate three (3) families. One family was able to repay the escrow fund that was used to assist them into replacement housing.

OTHER-We are currently working on disposal options for tracts located north of the Airport. We are

researching the land exchange options similar to those we have used in the past.

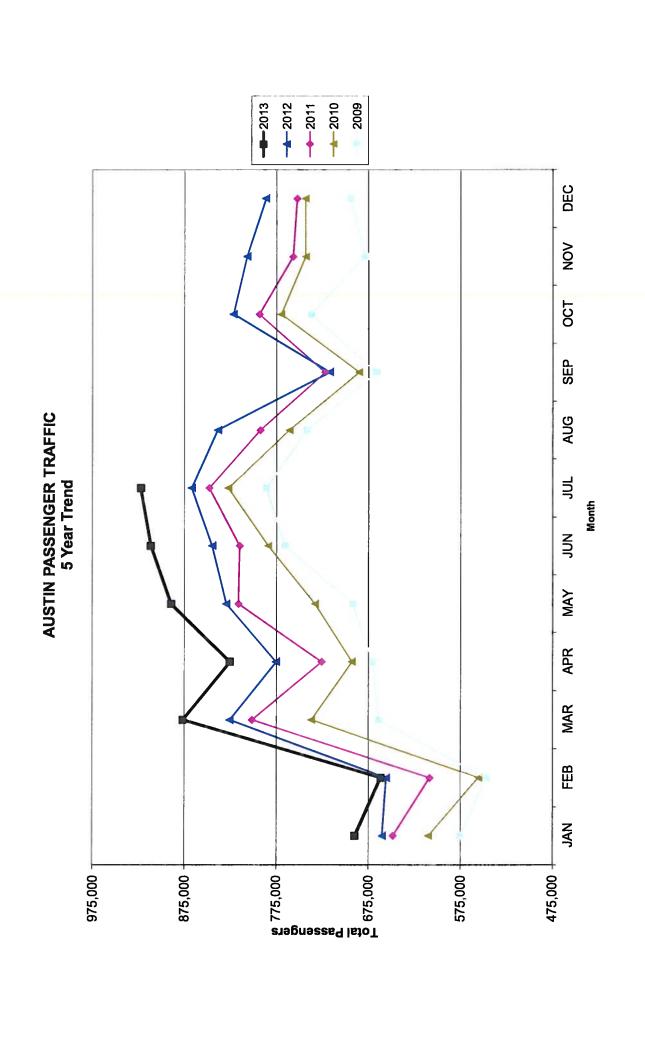

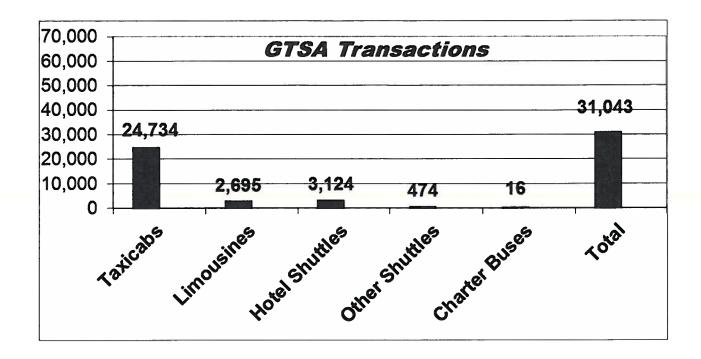

Additional Backup Information

This agreement is between the City of Austin Department of Aviation and the Capital Area Council of Governments to facilitate the replacement of 12 diesel powered aircraft support vehicles owned by Southwest Airlines with electric vehicles. The EPA will provide \$135,000 to CAPCOG to off-set the incremental costs of converting older diesel powered vehicles to electric. CAPCOG in compliance with grant requirements will provide funds directly to Southwest Airlines. The DOA will be the facilitator between CAPCOG and Southwest Airlines to ensure grant requirements are met for Southwest Airlines' equipment replacement at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA).
