

Southwest Austin District Proposed by the Oak Hill Association of Neighborhoods (OHAN)

The Oak Hill Association of Neighborhoods is comprised of 30+ Neighborhood Associations and HOAs covering a large portion of the proposed Southwest (SW) District. See the attached map.

The primary goal of OHAN is to meet the ordinance requirements. Our proposed district does this as follows:

a) The SW district is geographically contiguous.

- b) The SW district was created to keep local neighborhoods, schools, and interests in one district. The majority of the area contained in the proposed SW district participated in the 3-year project of creating the Oak Hill Neighborhood Plan and by doing so has developed a strong Community of Interest.
- c) The SW district was created to maintain geographic compactness and does not bypass local areas of population.

d) The SW district uses voting precincts borders as the district borders.

- e) The SW district was designed to us geographically identifiable boundaries as its borders. The geographical borders are the city limit to the West and South, Barton Creek to the North, and the district then continues to the East until the agregate population of approximately 79,000 people is reached.
- f) a strong minority population does not exist within, or near, to the proposed district.
- g) no manipulation of the SW district was necessary to meet these goals.

The members of the Oak Hill Association of Neighborhoods ask that the ICRC use the OHAN proposed SW District as a basis for creating a new city council district in the southwest Austin area.
