PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled, frame house with a front-gabled bay containing the partial-width inset entry porch; 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH


The house was built in 1948 by C.T. Johnson, a local builder. Gus and Carolyn Grosskopf were the first owners and occupants of the house; he was a typesetter who opened his own business with a partner while living in this house; she was a secretary at a loan company. The Grosskopfs lived here until around 1957, when the house was owned and occupied by Jeanne Brewton, a beauty salon owner who had previously owned a salon in Lubbock. She had Jeanne's Beauty Service on West Lynn Street; she apparently sold the business while living in this house – she was listed in later city directories as a beauty operator at Joseph's Beauty Service, in the same location as her business had been. Jeanne Brewton lived here from around 1957 to around 1965. Bobbie then Nealie Hampton rented then owned this house from the mid-1960s until the early 1980s. Both were accountants at the University of Texas. The house has been a rental property since the early 1980s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

Gustaf Grosskopf appears in the 1930 U.S. Census as the 5-year old son of William and Bertha Grosskopf, farmers in rural Travis County.

The address is listed in the directory, but is the old address for what is now 3221 Bonnie Lane. Gus M. and Carolyn Grosskopf are not listed in the directory.

Jeanne Brewton (ca. 1957 – ca. 1965)

Jeanne Brewton appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the wife of Chester Brewton, a shipping clerk for a beauty and barber supply company in Lubbock. Jeanne Brewton is listed as a 37-year old, Texas-born, proprietor of a beauty shop in Lubbock.
