# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION SEPTEMBER 23, 2013 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2013-0588 4710 SINCLAIR AVENUE

#### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1938 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan, frame house with a partial-width, inset porch on plain, square, wood posts; single and paired 6:6 fenestration.

#### RESEARCH

The house was built in 1938-39; the first occupants were Elmer L. and Lucille Turner, who are listed as the renters of the house in the 1940 city directory, and the owners of the house in the 1941 city directory. Elmer L. Turner was the shop foreman and service manager for Swearingen-Armstrong, the Ford, Mercury, and Lincoln Zephyr dealer in Austin. The Turners lived her until the early 1940s, then moved to 606½ Harris Avenue. Roy M. Trumbull, an assistant manager for the Mountjoy Parts Company, an auto parts company, and his wife, Helen, rented the house in the mid-1940s, then a claims examiner, Wilbur Towns, and his wife Doris, are listed as the owners of the house in the city directories of the late 1940s. Delia Agnew, a widow, who worked as a rate analyst for the State Board of Insurance Commissioners, owned the house in the mid- to late 1950s. A widow who worked as an office secretary at the University of Texas owned the house in the early 1960s. The house has had a series of owners through the late 1970s, including a book-keeper and a retired woman.


#### STAFF COMMENTS

### LOCATION MAP





NOTE: Elmer L. and Lucille Turner are listed as living at 1407 Alta Vista Avenue; he was the service manager for Swearingen-Armstrong Motor Company, Ford,

Mercury, and Lincoln Zephyr automobiles, 1<sup>st</sup> and Colorado Streets.

Elmer L. and Lucille Turner appear as the owners of this house in the 1940 U.S. Census. The house was worth \$3,600. Elmer L. Turner was then 26, had been born in Texas, and was a shop foreman for a retail automobile dealership and garage. Lucille Turner was then 24, and had been born in Texas. She had no occupation listed. They had no children living with them. In 1935, Elmer L. Turner had lived in El Campo, Texas. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Elmer L. Turner as the 17-year old son of Lee and Rada Turner, who lived on a rented farm in Coryell County, Texas. Elmer L. Turner had no occupation listed.
