Additional Backup Information

This action will authorize the negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with the Texas Department of Public Safety (TXDPS) that will define mutual obligations held by both parties.

The parties define respective responsibilities in the Capitol Complex, including private property within the Capitol Complex for the following:

1. Maintenance of signs, signals, street markings, and parking meters, and
2. Coordinating street closures, and
3. Traffic and parking enforcement, and general security, and
4. That in the event of significant event, the Austin Police Department (APD) law enforcement officers will have concurrent jurisdiction over State of Texas property located within the Capitol Complex, and
5. That no mutual aid request is necessary for APD officers to make an arrest in that jurisdiction for the duration of APD's participation in a significant event at the request of TXDPS.

This agreement becomes effective subsequent to being signed by all applicable parties and shall continue in full force and effect for ten (10) years after execution of the Agreement, unless amended in writing by the Parties.
