PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1939 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled board-and-batten, frame cottage with a central, partial-width, ornamental gable over the front door; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built ca. 1938-39 by Mrs. L.J. Coghlan, who never lived in it. The first occupants of the house were Homer and Mae McCook; Mae McCook's maiden name was Coghlan. Homer McCook was a pipefitter and later, a repairman at Austin State Hospital. He lived here until his death in 1953. His widow, Mae McCook, is listed as a babysitter in the city directory of 1954; otherwise, she had no occupation listed. She lived here until her death in 1970. The house became a rental unit after that time; tenants included restaurant workers at the Texas Chili Parlor and the Hyde Park Bar and Grille.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark – staff encourages relocation over demolition, but release the permit after completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

LOCATION MAP




