I live at 3931 Balcones Drive in Austin and I am very concerned about how my neighborhood will be grouped in the new city district map. My house is	
close to 35th Street and the Tarrytown neighborhood. My daughter went to Casis Elementary	
(across from Casis Shopping Center) and she now goes to O'Henry Middle School. I feel my	
neighborhood concerns are much more closely tied to Tarrytown, Bryker Woods & other inner	
city neighborhoods than the suburban areas with which our neighborhood is being grouped in the	
current map.	
Since living in this neighborhood, my neighbors and I have banned together to address MOPAC,	
inner city crime sprees and loss of services issues affecting our area. We had all those issues in	

common with the Tarrytown neighborhood which is on our southern border. For example, our police

representative said the same criminals hitting Tarrytown and Pemberton Heights a few years ago
spread north to our area so our neighbors kept in contact with neighborhood group organizers
in Tarrytown to work on crime watches and sharing of tips. Considering that MOPAC, innercity
crime and loss of services have been our big areas of concern, it makes NO SENSE at all for
our area to be grouped in with neighborhoods that are physically far from the center of town. Those
neighborhoods will have an entirely different group of issues as their priorities.
The idea our concerns will end up being minimized by grouping us with people who share few
of our issues upsets me greatly and runs completely contrary to the goal of district representation
Please let me know what can be done to correct this situation before it becomes permanent.
