Funding in the amount of \$83,333 is available in the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Operating Budget of the Austin Fire Department. Funding for the remaining forty six months of the original contract period is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Additional Backup Information

This contract for the purchase of wildfire protection equipment and supplies for inventory for the new Wildfire Division of the Austin Fire Department. This inventory will match the equipment that is used by Fire Departments regionally. This is effective when a fire does breakout and Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) arrives on the scene with other municipalities, they offer one for one exchanges for fire gear on an as needed basis provided the gear matches theirs. TIFMAS uses General Services Administration equipment.
