The motion to override the term limit provision in accordance with article 4(C) in order to nominate Dale Murphy as Chair, was approved on Commission Member Ernest Saulmon's motion, Commission Member James Kelsey's second on a 3-0-1 vote. Chair Dale Murphy abstained from the vote. Vice Chair Steven Hart, Commission Member George Farris, and Commission Member Rose Marie Klee were absent.

The motion to nominate Dale Murphy as Chair was approved on Commission Member Ernest Saulmon's motion, Commission Member James Kelsey's second on a 3-0-1 vote. Chair Dale Murphy abstained from the vote. Vice Chair Steven Hart, Commission Member George Farris, and Commission Member Rose Marie Klee were absent.

The motion to nominate Ernest Saulmon as Vice-Chair was approved on Secretary D'Ann Johnson's motion, Commission Member James Kelsey's second on a 3-0-1 vote. Commission Member Ernest Saulmon abstained from the vote. Vice Chair Steven Hart, Commission Member George Farris, and Commission Member Rose Marie Klee were absent.

In accordance with article 4(C) of the Austin Airport Advisory Commission Bylaws, "the board may override the term limit provision for an officer by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the authorized board members." Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements service contract with SIMPLEX GRINNELL L.P., or one of the other qualified offerors to RFP No. PAX0108 for inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, upgrades, and new system installation for fire alarm, suppression, alarm monitoring, and related systems for various City Departments in an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$1,400,000 per option for a total contract amount not to exceed \$8,400,000. Authorize award and execution of various supply and service contracts during the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 through the STATE OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION RESOURCES (DIR) cooperative purchasing program for the purchase of computer, telephone, and network hardware and related maintenance services in an amount not to exceed \$30,606,339. [Item went before City Council on September 26, 2013 and passed.]

Authorize award and execution of various service contracts during the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 through the STATE OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION RESOURCES cooperative purchasing program for the purchase of technology services in an amount not to exceed \$37,365,387. [Item went before City Council on September 26, 2013 and passed.]

Authorize negotiation and execution of a 36-month rewards program administration agreement with Thanks Again, LLC to provide an airport centered loyalty/rewards program with estimated monthly program fees of \$5,000 per month, for a total contract

amount not to exceed \$180,000. [Item went before City Council on October 3, 2013 and passed.]

Approve an inter-local agreement between City of Austin Department of Aviation and the Capital Area Council of Governments to facilitate an Environmental Protection Agency Diesel Emission Reduction Act grant to replace diesel powered equipment operated by Southwest Airlines with electric equipment. Approve a resolution authorizing acceptance of grants from the Federal Aviation Administration, the Department of Homeland Security, and other agencies of the United States Government in an amount not to exceed \$30,000,000 to the City of Austin, Department of Aviation, for Austin-Bergstrom International Airport for Fiscal Year 2013-2014. Project Status: MOBILE HOME PARK: To-date, we have made offers on thirty-five (35) mobile homes. We are searching for comparable housing and preparing offer packages for the remaining residents at the park. We anticipate completing all offers by the end of November, 2013. All thirty-five (35) offers have been accepted. We have purchased thirty-four (34) homes. We anticipate purchasing the one (1) mobile home currently under contract in November, 2013, as we are assisting the occupant to obtain replacement housing. Of the thirty-four (34) acquired homes, one (1) is occupied and thirty-three (33) have been vacated. Asbestos abatement and demolition have been completed on twenty-nine (29) of the vacated mobile homes. The next round of abatement and demolition will be scheduled in November, 2013. In summary, of the thirty-eight (38) mobile homes in the park, thirty-four (34) have been purchased. Four (4) mobile homes remain to be purchased.

LAWSUIT: SH71 Partners' lawsuit was dismissed. To-date, we have utilized the escrow account to help relocate four (4) families, but one (1) of the families repaid the escrow funds that were used to assist them. We anticipate needing the escrow fund for one (1) additional family.

OTHER: The Airport plans to dispose of this tract by Land Exchange. Although the park is not yet vacant,

we have ordered appraisals and expect to receive them by the end of November, 2013.







This service contract is for a City-wide agreement with Texas Industries for the Blind and Handicapped, Inc. (TIBH) for temporary personnel services on an as needed basis for various City departments. The temporary positions will be filled primarily for clerical type job titles, but may also include Accountant, Attorney, Executive Assistant, System Support Technician, Maintenance Worker, Dispatcher, Senior Buyer and other closely related titles. The City has been using TIBH since December 4, 2004 with its subcontractor, Goodwill Temporary Services, Inc. to meet the City's temporary clerical personnel needs. The existing contract for these services is due to expire on December 14, 2013.

Temporary employees are assigned to specific areas and are normally used exclusively in those areas.
