

Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance regarding the East Sixth Street Public Improvement District 2014 assessment roll and authorize the levying of 2014 assessments.

## Amount and Source of Funding

Funding at the approved 2014 assessment rate of $\$ 0.15 / \$ 100$ valuation is estimated to produce $\$ 66,953$ at a $90 \%$ collection rate.

| On November 7, 2013, the City Council approved the 2014 assessment rate for the East Sixth Street Public <br> Improvement District (PID) (at the rate of \$0.15 per \$100 valuation), and approved the proposed 2014 assessment <br> roll (list of property owners subject to the assessment). The assessments paid by property owners funds the PID <br> services. |  |
| State law requires the City Council to conduct a public hearing to consider the proposed assessments. Approval of the <br> assessment rate and proposed roll on November 7, 2013 trigged notices being sent to property owners, giving them <br> an opportunity to review the property valuations prior to the public hearing. Property owners have a statutory right to <br> challenge the assessment placed on their property at the public hearing. Approval of the assessment roll ordinance is <br> the final Council action required in the annual process of approving PID assessments. |  |
