  - i) Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements service contract with FUSION SERVICES LTD dba. AUTO GATE; COMPOUND SECURITY SPECIALISTS. to provide on-site automatic gates maintenance and repair services for various City Departments, in an amount not to exceed \$783,163.86, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$261,054 per extension option, a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,566,327. MOBILE HOME PARK: To-date, we have made offers on thirty-seven (37) mobile homes. We have the offer ready for the last (38th) home and are attempting to locate one of the owners. Thirty-six (36) offers have been accepted. We have purchased thirty-five (35) homes. We anticipate purchasing the one (1) mobile home currently under contract in January, 2014, as we are assisting the occupants to obtain replacement housing. Of the thirty-five (35) acquired homes, one (1) is occupied and thirty-four (34) have been vacated. Asbestos abatement and demolition have been completed on twenty-nine (29) of the vacated mobile homes. Demolition is in the final stages on another three (3) homes. We are awaiting asbestos surveys, and then the next round of abatement and demolition will be scheduled in December, 2013. We continue to assist low-income owners with getting approved in area mobile home parks and with obtaining home loans. We are also assisting an owner trying to purchase a conventional home. We have utilized the SH71 Partners escrow account to help relocate four (4) families, but one (1) of the families repaid the escrow funds that were used to assist them. We anticipate needing the escrow fund for one (1) additional family. In summary, of the thirty-eight (38) mobile homes in the park, thirty-five (35) have been purchased. Three (3) mobile homes remain to be purchased.

OTHER: The Airport plans to dispose of the Mobile Home Park and vacant lot located on Shapard Lane by Land Exchange. Although the park is not yet vacant, we ordered an appraisal to determine its fair market value.







The City contracted through the State of Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) with Summus, a minority sub-contractor for Dell, for these products and services. This contract was cancelled before the planned end date in 2015 due to the discontinuation of Dell's contract with DIR. To prevent disruption to City services, SHI of Somerset, NJ, has been providing the products and services through DIR since the discontinuation of the contract with Summus. As a result, the City is now requesting

ratification of a new contract for Microsoft products through DIR with SHI for the remaining two years of the initial contract through Fiscal Year 2015.

The annual amount of the contract is based on the number of computers that have accessed the network and the existing software licenses. The contract will also include a contingency amount for new software products and additional licenses to be added as required, with the additional costs to be billed upon an annual "true up" at the end of each contract year.

A contingency of 20% is being requested to cover both the annual true up of core client access licenses as well as the cost of any required Microsoft products not identified to date. The agreement will cover all Microsoft products that may be requested within the contract period.

There may be large purchase requirements during the contract period that are unknown at this time. Therefore, any future large Microsoft product requests which may be required for a specific project and which exceed the threshold requiring Council authority will be requested via a separate RCA.

There has been a 2% price increase between the last contract and this contract.

The initial Microsoft enterprise license agreement, which was approved in September, 2010 for 60 months, included the basic software needed to run the business of the City and any subsequent upgrades. Six amendments added other Microsoft products to the Enterprise License Agreement. The City contracted through Department of Information Resources (DIR) with Summus, a minority sub-contractor for Dell for these products and services.

This contract was cancelled before the planned end date in 2015 due to the discontinuation of Dell's contract with DIR. To prevent disruption to City services, SHI, another DIR vendor, has been providing the products and services since the end of the contract with Summus in June 2013. As a result, the City is now requesting ratification of a new contract for Microsoft products through DIR with SHI.

The annual amount of the contract will be based on the number of computers that have accessed the network and the existing licenses for Microsoft products. The contract will also include a contingency amount for new software products and additional licenses to be added as required, with the additional costs to be billed upon an annual "true up" at the end of each contract year. A contingency of 20% is being requested to cover both the annual true up of core client access licenses as well as the cost of any required Microsoft products not identified to date. The agreement will cover all Microsoft products that may be requested within the contract period.

There may be large purchase requirements during the contract period that are unknown at this time. Therefore, any future large Microsoft product requests which may be required for a specific project and which exceed the threshold requiring Council authority will be requested via a separate RCA.
