Authorize negotiation and execution of Amendment # 6 to the agreement with AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN AND BOYS HARVEST FOUNDATION, Inc., Austin, TX to increase funding in an amount not to exceed \$102,000 for programs that enhance the quality of life for African American youth and families for the period October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$715,430.

Funding in the amount of \$102,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Operating Budget of Health and Human Services Department.

Additional Backup Information

African American Men and Boys Harvest Foundation (AAMBHF), a 501(c) (3) nonprofit corporation, works cooperatively with local school districts and institutions of higher education to identify barriers preventing academic achievement and to eliminate the academic achievement gap between African American and Caucasian students. The City provided initial funding to expand their Resource Center in May of 2011. AAMBHF staff develops strategies designed to reduce the dropout rate and mitigate underachievement in academic performance of African American males and females. The funding in the amount of \$102,000 endorses the expansion of the AAMBHF Programs and increases the City's financial contribution to support the provision of services throughout the contract period.

Performance Measures, as well as contract exhibits, will be negotiated with the African American Men and Boys Harvest Foundation staff.
