Authorize award and execution of a 24-month service requirements agreement with ALL POINTS INSPECTION SERVICES, INC, (WBE /FB) or one of the other qualified bidders for IFB SDC0185, for cleaning and closed circuit television inspection of storm drain infrastructure for the Watershed Protection Department in an amount not to exceed \$738,149, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$369,075 per option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,845,375.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$369,075 is available in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Capital Budget of the Watershed Protection Department. Funding for the remaining 12 months of the initial term and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

MBE / WBE:	This contract will be awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9C (Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

Additional Backup Information

The City of Austin has over 900 miles of storm drain infrastructure. Many of these storm drains have been in place for decades and their current conditions are unknown. This contract will provide pre-cleaning and internal closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspection and condition assessment. The contract will be used by the Watershed Protection Department (WPD) to augment existing CCTV activities conducted by WPD staff. The inspections will assist in prioritizing and directing operational and capital resources for replacing or rehabilitating aging storm drain infrastructure. In addition to the storm drain condition information, the inspection services will assist in the completion of the final phase of WPD's storm drain mapping effort through field location verification of underground storm drain infrastructure, including inlet and/or outlet connections.

A team composed of personnel from the Watershed Protection Department with expertise in this area evaluated the bids and unanimously chose this bid as the best to provide these services.

This request allows for the development of an agreement with a qualified offeror that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the selected offeror, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified offeror and authorize contract negotiations with that provider.

PRICE ANALYSIS

- a. Adequate competition
- b. 93 notices were sent, including six MBE and one WBE firms. Five bids were received, with one response from WBE.
- c. This is a new contracted service and there is no previous pricing history.

APPROVAL JUSTIFICATION

- a. The recommended bidder submitted the second lowest total price offer and earned the highest overall score for the Invitation for Bid Best Value.
